RV Sites and Campgrounds

Many states around the country offer lush forests, winding rivers or seemingly endless coastlines – but only one state, Florida, offers them all. Florida is unique for its natural beauty, and one way to touch nature directly is by sleeping under the stars. Florida's favorable climate makes camping enjoyable year-round, and if you're traveling in an RV, why not travel along one of the many Scenic Highways?





1 Panhandle Region

If you're RVing along the white sand beaches of the Gulf of Mexico, along the western side of the state, take a stop or two along Florida's first Scenic Highway – **Pensacola Scenic Bluffs**. Perdido Cove RV Resort & Marina is a popular spot for those wanting to enjoy the spectacular views of the Intracoastal Waterway and the Gulf of Mexico. Just a little farther south along U.S. 98, stop and rest at the Playground RV Park in Fort Walton Beach before you get to **Scenic Highway 30A**. Another popular RV Campground in this area is the award-winning RV Park at Topsail Hill State Preserve at the western end of the corridor. Be sure to check out the world famous coastal dune lakes while you are in Walton County. These beautiful lakes are rare and, in the U.S., are found exclusively along the Gulf Coast.

2 North Florida

Check out North Florida for some "Southern Charm." Much of the history, culture and natural wonder found in Florida can be accessed from any of this region's Scenic Highways. Travel to and stay along some of the oldest roads in the state at the Thunder Gulch Campground in Bunnell or the Bulow Plantation RV Resort on Flagler Beach, both of which are located along the **Heritage Crossroads: Miles of History Scenic Highway** in the northeast part of the state. Take a short drive to the north and experience America's Oldest City, St. Augustine, while hooking up your RV at one of the only designated RV parks located on the beach. Located along the **A1A Scenic & Historic Coastal Byway**, the Bryn Mawr Ocean Resort offers 250 licensed sites with such amenities as cable TV, a pool, laundry and a playground. Or, if you find yourself on the southern end of the corridor, then the Beverly Beach Camptown Store



3 Indian River Lagoon

Thinking about taking your RV to the moon? Well, not literally. But, if you want to see where the real astronauts took rockets and space shuttles into outer space at Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral, then enjoy the trip along the **Indian River Lagoon National Scenic Byway**. Pull over for the night at the Manatee Hammock Park in Titusville, the closest campsite to Kennedy Space Center. After you are done reaching new heights in outer space, come back to earth and experience the deep blue sea of the Atlantic Ocean. Maybe try a little surfing around Cocoa Beach and rest at the Sunrise Palms RV Park in Cocoa.

4 Central Florida

While Central Florida is known worldwide for its theme parks, there is much more to offer when it comes to outdoor fun. Enjoy surfing in the Atlantic, golfing at the hundreds of golf courses or hiking through forests, hills and around the many lakes. If you feel like venturing inland and are looking for ease of travel, take your RV down the **Suncoast Scenic Parkway**. If you need to stop while on your journey, pull into the Belle Parc RV Resort, Camper's Holiday Travel Park or the Hidden Valley Campground, all located in Brooksville, just off the Scenic Highway.

5 Clearwater

If you are near Tampa Bay and traveling to Clearwater, try the **Courtney Campbell Scenic Highway**, along the Courtney Campbell Causeway. The Clearwater Travel Resort is the perfect spot for families to pull over in their RVs and enjoy a picnic under a shade tree. Or, if just you and your significant other are looking for an adult RV Park, try the Travel World RV Park, also located in Clearwater. Enjoy the heated pool, Jacuzzi or exercise facilities, play some pool or shuffleboard and maybe do some dancing. The park is close to shopping, the Gulf Beaches and the Pinellas Trail, too!



6 Bradenton Beach

South Florida is where the natural and built environment meet in a laid-back atmosphere filled with beauty and culture. The cities are located mostly along the coast, lining such outdoor contributions as the gulf, the ocean and the Florida Everglades. Stop along **Bradenton Beach Scenic Highway**, make camp at the Horseshoe Cove Carefree RV Resort in Bradenton and enjoy amenities that allow you to do just what the name implies – let your cares melt away!

7 Florida Keys

From South Florida, travel even farther south (to the southernmost point in the continental U.S.) along Florida's All-American Road, the **Florida Keys Scenic Highway**. If you have a boat, then put it in the water and dock at the Sunshine Key RV Resort & Marina on Big Pine Key. From there, it's just a little further to the southernmost point at mile marker 0 along U.S. 1 in Key West. Stay at Boyd's Key West Campground and experience the nightlife and other happenings around the island. You'll never want to leave!
